



How does Jeli Children's Club know if a child needs extra help and what should I do if I think my child may have special educational needs?

We work closely with Crawley Down Village C of E School, to help support your child. Your child will be invited to attend a taster session and we can talk to you about any of your concerns.

How will the staff support my child?

We have experienced staff, who will adapt the level of support or help your child requires. This will be based on conversations with the school, parents and initial observations.

How will the curriculum be matched to my child's needs?

We do not follow a curriculum; however, we offer a balance of structure and child led activities and free play. We follow your child's interests while planning according to these interests and include the children's ideas and thoughts.

How will both you and I know how my child is doing and how will you help me to support my child's learning?

All staff are available to have an informal chat at the end of session if you have any concerns. The Managers are available for a meeting, which can be arranged via telephone or E-Mail.

What support will there be for my child's overall well-being?

Jeli Children's Club has policies and procedures in place to ensure every child's absolute safety here at the setting.

What specialist services and expertise are available at or accessed by the setting?

We have strong links with Crawley Down Village School and would draw upon their expertise.

What training are the staff supporting children with SEND had or having?

Staff have a wealth of experience and training.

Lisa is NNEB qualified and has also worked closely with children with Autism.

Tracy has over 13 years' experience as SEN support within the school, is a Learning Mentor and a mental health first aider.

Coral is our SENCO; she has a B.A (Hons) in Early Years and childhood studies.

Paula has extensive experience working closely with SEN children in her previous role as a Learning Mentor, Paula is also a mental health first aider.



How accessible is the setting?

Jeli Club is on one level, there is also an accessible toilet. Jeli Club also benefits from private kitchen facilities.

How will the setting support my child to transfer to the next stage of education and life?

Jeli Club will offer taster sessions to children and their parents, to come and visit us to meet the staff and the other children and spend time in the setting.

How are the setting's resources allocated and matched to children's special educational needs?

We carefully assess, monitor and review each individual's needs. Resources are then allocated so that all children can have full access to the equipment and setting's areas of learning

How is the decision made about what type and how much support my child will receive?

Before the child starts, we would liaise with the parents to help build up a picture of what their child needs and the parents may be invited to have a meeting about how their child is settling in.

How are parents involved in the setting? How can I be involved?

Parents/carers can email or phone us directly. Parents/carers are also encouraged to have on-going dialogue with staff. There is also a twice yearly newsletter for parents/carers. Staff are always available at the end of session to help with a concerns or issues that may arise.
